On June 28, 2021 Edward Anthony Fedok went to his eternal rest at the age of 75. He was the only son of the late Stephen and Mary Fedok and grew up in Allentown's sixth ward. It was there he developed his love for family, baseball and basketball.

Ed was the beloved husband of JoAnne (Weber) Fedok for almost 52 years. He was a loving, devoted father to Amy (Scott Coll) and Jason (Lindsay Huff) and a proud grandfather to his seven grandchildren: Lindsay, Kate, Ryan, Nina, Adam, Connor and Camden. He spent his life making memories with his family. He enjoyed his annual trips to Walt Disney World, loved eating Springer's ice cream while vacationing in Stone Harbor, NJ, had a great passion for riding roller coasters, enjoyed water parks wherever he could find them, and loved watching baseball games in various stadiums around the country. Coaching his son's baseball and basketball teams and cheering on his son during Lake Placid Ironman triathlons were particular sources of joy in his life.

Ed graduated from Allentown Central Catholic High School in 1963 where he was an integral part of the baseball and basketball teams. He was awarded the 1963 CCHS Outstanding Player award. He continued his education at Dickinson College (1967) and Dickinson School of Law (1970). He was awarded the Dickinson College Athlete of the Year award in 1967. He was inducted into the Dickinson College Athletics Hall of Fame. He continued his love of baseball by playing in a senior men's hardball league and played

pickup basketball games until he was 70.

Ed found his professional calling as a lawyer serving his community. He practiced law for 50 years and dedicated his private practice to local Lehigh Valley clients. He served as a Captain in the U.S. Army JAG Corps for four years stationed at Fort Carson, Colorado. He started his civilian practice with Butz, Hudders, and Tallman and then became a shareholder at the law firm of Stevens & Lee. He was also a former member of the Salisbury Township School Board.
